Spread across the unique Tagus river, seven hills and overlooking the majestic Atlantic ocean, **Lisboa** is a key business centre and a top MI (Meetings Industry) destination.

20th June – Monday Cocktail in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs - Palácio das Necessidades

Palácio das Necessidades is one of the rare constructions that stood the earthquake of 1755. The palace has beautiful gardens, with vast collection of exotic plants. It was a royal residence until the beginning of the XX century (almost all the Portuguese kings lived here), when the monarchy was abolished in Portugal. In 1910, the palace saw its precious art collections divided by several museums. After the establishment of the Republic, Palácio das Necessidades was empty until it was occupied by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, settled there around the year 1926. In May 1952, the Ministry also took up the old Convent's building which had been Lisbon's Military Headquarters, as well as the Headquarters of the Republican Guard.







SINTRA

Sintra is magical and romantic, rich in memories of its former days as the Royal "familie<mark>s"</mark> Summe<mark>r resor</mark>t.

Within its medieval wall is also a Gothic cathedral, Renaissance palaces, a macabre chapel covered with thousands of human skulls and bones, and **picturesque squares**. Just outside town is the "Portuguese Stonehenge" (the Cromlech of Almendres), a group of stones standing as the most important megalithic group in the Iberian Peninsula. Nearby is also Europe's largest dolmen, the Great Dolmen of Zambujeiro. All together, they make up **one of Portugal's most delightful destinations**.
